



- ESV **Daniel 7:1** In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon, Daniel saw a dream and visions of his head as he lay in his bed. Then he wrote down the dream and told the sum of the matter.
- ² Daniel declared, "I saw in my vision by night, and behold, the four winds of heaven were stirring up the great sea. ³ And four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another.
 - ⁴The first was like a lion and had eagles' wings...
 - 5 And behold, another beast, a second one, like a bear...
 - 6 After this I looked, and behold, another, like a leopard, with four wings of a bird on its back...
 - ⁷ After this I saw in the night visions, and behold, a fourth beast, terrifying and dreadful and exceedingly strong... It was different from all the beasts that were before it, and it had ten horns...
- ⁹ As I looked, thrones were placed, and the Ancient of days took his seat; his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames; its wheels were burning fire.
 ¹⁰ A stream of fire issued and came out from before him; a thousand thousands served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him; the court sat in judgment, and the books were opened.
 - 11 I looked then ... And as I looked, the beast was killed... 12 As for the rest of the beasts, their dominion was taken away...
- 13 I saw in the night visions, and behold, with the clouds of heaven there came one like a son of man, and he came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before him. 14 And to him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him; his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom one that shall not be destroyed.

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 - Increasingly nasty beasts represent kingdoms which rule, devour, and crush.

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- The "one like a son of man" is a human here came one like a son of man, ¹⁴ And to him was given dominion figure with dominion over the animals. uld serve him: his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom one that shall not be destroyed.

¹⁶ I approached one of those who stood there and asked him the truth concerning all this....

¹⁷ 'These four great beasts are four kings who shall arise out of the earth.

18 But the saints of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom forever, forever and ever.'

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19 "Then I desired to know the truth about the fourth beast, which was different from all the rest, exceedingly terrifying ... 20 and about the ten horns that were on its head. and the other horn that came up... 21 As I looked, this horn made war with the saints and prevailed over them,

²² until the Ancient of Days came,

and judgment was given for the saints of the Most High, and the time came when the saints possessed the kingdom.

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A heavenly court is convened

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²³ "Thus he said: 'As for the fourth beast, there shall be a fourth kingdom on earth... and it shall devour the whole earth ... ²⁴ As for the ten horns, out of this kingdom ten kings shall arise, and another shall arise after them... ²⁵ He shall speak words against the Most High, and shall wear out the saints of the Most High... and they shall be given into his hand for a time, times, and half a time.

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and his dominion shall be taken away, to be consumed and destroyed to the end.

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How are Dan 2 and Dan 7 alike?

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Four kingdoms, decreasing in glory and increasing in wickedness

followed by the kingdom of God (the Stone or the Son of Man)

- Mark 2:10 But that you may know that the **Son of Man** has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he said to the paralytic—**Mark 2:28** So the **Son of Man** is lord even of the Sabbath."
- Mark 8:31 And he began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again.
- Mark 8:38 For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the **Son of Man** also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."
- Mark 9:9 And as they were coming down the mountain, he charged them to tell no one what they had seen, until the Son of Man had risen from the dead.
- Mark 9:12 And he said to them, "Elijah does come first to restore all things. And how is it written of the Son of Man that he should suffer many things and be treated with contempt?
- Mark 9:31 for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him. And when he is killed, after three days he will rise."
- Mark 10:33 saying, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death and deliver him over to the Gentiles.
- Mark 10:45 For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
- Mark 13:26 And then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory.

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Matt 10:31 Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. ³² So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, ³³ but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.

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Luke 12:8 "And I tell you, everyone who acknowledges me before men, the Son of Man also will acknowledge before the angels of God, 9 but the one who denies me before men will be denied before the angels of God.

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Mark 13:24-26 '24" But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, ²⁵ and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. ²⁶ And then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory.'

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Mark 14:57-62 ⁵⁷ And some stood up and bore false witness against him, saying, ⁵⁸ "We heard him say, 'I will destroy this temple that is made with hands, and in three days I will build another, not made with hands." ⁵⁹ Yet even about this their testimony did not agree. ⁶⁰ And the high priest stood up in the midst and asked Jesus, "Have you no answer to make? What is it that these men testify against you?" ⁶¹ But he remained silent and made no answer. Again the high priest asked him, "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?" ⁶² And Jesus said, "I am, and you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of Power, and coming with the clouds of heaven."

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How is Jesus the Son of Man??

He himself is the new Adam and the new Israel

who (having suffered like the saints of the most High)

will be vindicated by God in the end times.

He is the one who has been given the kingdom:
"Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand."

"SON OF MAN" AND "SON OF GOD"

- Not affirmations of the humanity and divinity of Christ, respectively
 - "Son of God" is a rulership (messianic) title, which takes on divine connotations at some points in the NT.
 - "Son of Man" (in the Dan 7 context) is the more exalted figure, with distinct connotations of divinity.

"SON OF MAN" AND "SON OF GOD"

- Both come back to a royal, Adam-Israel theology, which is applied to Jesus
 - The "son of man" is Adam (Dan 7; Ps 8) and the "son of God" is Adam (Lk 4 and its parallel with "image of God")
 - The "son of man" is Israel and the "son of God" is Israel.

"SON OF MAN" AND "SON OF GOD"

- Jesus is both "Son of Man" and "Son of God," but prefers the "Son of Man" designation in his own politically-charged setting.
- After his resurrection, the church simply chose to refer to him as the "Son of God."
